Subject: 2021 Accessibility Compliance Reporting

Report Number: CS 21- 66

Division: Corporate Services

Department: Accessibility and Special Projects

Purpose: For Decision

Executive Summary:

This report is intended to provide an update on Norfolk County's legislated requirements under the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005 (AODA)* and its Regulation, the *Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation (O. Reg. 191/11) (IASR).*

The AODA requires designated public sector organizations to file Accessibility Compliance Reports every two years. Norfolk County must report to the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility by December 31, 2021.

Discussion:

Norfolk County's Accessibility Compliance Report includes 25 questions, as attached.

Although Norfolk County continues to work towards compliance, the County will be in a position to report non-compliance on question 14 as it relates to the Norfolk County website as outlined in Part II, Information and Communications Standard of the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation O.reg. 191/11 (IASR):

"As of January 1, 2021, do all your organization's internet websites conform to World Wide Web Consortium Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.0 Level AA (except for live captions and pre-recorded audio descriptions)?"

s.14(4) of the Information and Communication Standard of the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation states that "Designated public sector organizations and large organizations for their internet websites shall meet the requirements of this section in accordance with the following schedule: By January 1, 2021, all internet websites and web content on those sites must conform with WCAG 2.0 Level AA, other than,

i. success criteria 1.2.4 Captions (live), and

ii. success criteria 1.2.5 Audio Descriptions (Pre-recorded)".

Due to the dynamic nature of website and web content accessibility, it is difficult for any entity to prove with 100% certainty that their websites and web content are meeting

WCAG 2.0 Level AA compliance at all times. A single non-compliant PDF can take a website's accessibility compliance level from 100% to 0% instantaneously. The current model of compliance reporting is simply a snapshot in time – it is possible that an entity could be compliant (or not) at the time of reporting and have that status change overnight. Based on conversations within the Ontario Network of Accessibility Professionals (ONAP) a large majority of Municipalities will be reporting non-compliance on their websites and web content. Web content and website accessibility is a complicated topic that Municipalities across the Province have been working diligently to address. This includes Norfolk County Staff.

Corporate Services staff believe achieving website compliance requires a 3-tiered approach:

- 1. Condensing Content
 - a. This includes removing outdated, irrelevant, non-compliant content on Norfolk County web platforms
 - b. Taking an inventory of what is currently on any County web domains and allowing appropriate Departments to determine what content is relevant to citizens and what content can simply be removed
 - c. There is likely a large inventory of inaccessible PDF's that can be removed from County websites that are not being visited, may be providing inaccurate information or can be provided in accessible HTML format on web pages rather than in PDF format
 - d. Removing unneeded content lessens potential document remediation efforts and provides an improved website user experience for residents and website visitors alike

2. Training and Licensing

- a. The vast majority of website compliance complications arise with web content rather than the web platform itself. Ensuring that WCAG compliant content is being uploaded on a regular basis is imperative in maintaining an accessible website
- b. In order to ensure accessible content is being uploaded onto the website, accessible document training will continue to be provided to County staff who have website-uploading capabilities
- c. Additionally, staff who have not had any form of accessible document training and do not have an Adobe Acrobat Pro license (version required to upload accessible PDFs) will not have website-uploading capabilities. This ensures that anyone uploading content onto the website has both the proper training and technology to create accessible documents

3. Maintenance

- a. After taking significant strides to reduce inaccessible content on the Norfolk County website, there needs to be an ongoing commitment to continue to upload fully compliant content on all web platforms
- b. This means monitoring Adobe Acrobat Pro licenses and uploading rights on an annual basis

c. Providing "refresher" accessible document training while ensuring any new employees starting with the County who have website upload rights are provided with document training as a part of their on-boarding process

d. Corporate Services Staff (Accessibility, Information Technology and Corporate Communications) are investigating the feasibility of automated website scanning tools that can easily and accurately scan website platforms and their content for WCAG 2.0 Level AA compliance. Leveraging a tool like this would significantly reduce manual scanning tactics and would provide County Staff with an up-to date inventory of where the website stands at all times as it relates to web compliance

There is a lot of work to be done as it relates to the Norfolk County website inventory and its level of compliance under the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.0 Level AA standards. With that being said, Accessibility and Special Projects, along with the support of other Corporate Services Departments, are committed to taking meaningful steps towards achieving full levels of compliance as soon as possible in 2022 while putting forward a sustainable effort to maintain this level of compliance.

Compliance reporting requires two individuals in the organization – one to answer the questions and one to verify that the information is accurate. Even though the County is filing a report to verify compliance, the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility may audit the County at any time to verify the information that has been provided is true.

Financial Services Comments:

There are no direct financial implications related to staff's recommendation to complete, verify and submit the Accessibility Compliance Report. However, as noted, Norfolk County is in non-compliance and failure to comply could result in future penalties and fines.

Interdepartmental Implications:

The responsibility for the implementation of the *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act* (AODA) and the *Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation* (IASR) falls within the Accessibility and Special Projects Department. Accessibility and Special Projects is responsible for ensuring compliance at the corporate level, is the focal point for legislative analysis, and subject matter expertise. Departments/Divisions retain the accountability for ensuring that their respective areas are meeting legislative requirements as outlined in the above Standards.

Consultation(s):

Strategic Plan Linkage:

This report aligns with the 2019-2022 Council Strategic Priority "Build and Maintain Reliable, Quality Infrastructure" and "Focus on Service".

Explanation:

Building, renovating and maintaining County facilities that meet barrier-free design requirements under the Ontario Building Code and built environment requirements under the Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation allows the County to continue building and maintaining reliable, quality infrastructure. Quality infrastructure throughout County facilities provide equal access to all individuals, regardless of ability levels. The accessible built environment is a point of emphasis across all County facilities. By providing inclusive and barrier-free customer service, supported by robust Accessibility Policies and Procedures, Norfolk County Staff are putting an emphasis on improved customer service and an increased focus on service as a whole.

Conclusion:

Although Norfolk County is in non-compliance, the County should proceed with filing the Accessibility Compliance Report to the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility. A large majority of municipalities in Ontario will also likely be reporting non-compliance in regards to their website accessibility as outlined above. In a further effort to communicate the difficulty to meet WCAG 2.0 AA requirements, transparent and honest reporting is an important tool to let the Ministry know that further support is required to Municipalities across the Province.

Recommendation(s):

THAT Staff Report CS 21-66, 2021 Accessibility Compliance Reporting, be received as information;

AND THAT the County Clerk be authorized to verify and submit the Accessibility Compliance Report to the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility.
