By-Law 2024-107

Being a by-law to Delegate Authority to Approve Property Tax Apportionments

WHEREAS Section 23.1 of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25* provides that a municipality may delegate certain powers and duties;

AND WHEREAS Section 8(1) of the *Municipal Act, 2001, S.O 2001, c.25* as amended, provides in part that the powers of a municipality under this or any other Act shall be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on the municipality to enable the municipality to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate and to enhance the municipality's ability to respond to municipal issues;

AND WHEREAS Council deems it appropriate to delegate authority to staff for the purpose of approving property tax apportionments under Section 356 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O 2001, c. 25.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF NORFOLK COUNTY HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. GENERAL

A. All authorities and powers delegated in this By-Law may be further designated in writing and re conveyed automatically to those performing the duties of a position in an acting or interim capacity;

2. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

- A. That Council delegate authority to the Treasurer or to a person designated by By-Law to represent the Treasurer in such matters to approve property tax apportionments under Section 356 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25 pending the following criteria are met:
 - i. All or a portion of taxes levied on a retired roll are outstanding.
 - ii. All notification requirements as set out in Section 356 of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O 2001, c.25 have been met.

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That the effective date of this by-law shall be the date of passage thereof.
